KCS YOUTH LEAGUE INFORMATION:

COLLEGE LEAGUE:

- College League will play with a Junior Size Basketball and the hoops will be at 8'.
- There is no full court pressing allowed in the College League, teams can only play defense in the half court.
- Each Saturday will follow this typical schedule:
 1. 9:00-9:05: Announcements, Prayer and Character focus of the day
 2. 9:05-9:30: Skill and drill work covering a specific basketball skill
 3. 9:30-9:40: Team time with coaches at a basket to prepare for game
 4. 9:40-9:45: Drink Break and free throws
 5. 9:45-10:30: Game
- Each player on each team will shoot 2 free throws before the start of the game. Any free throws made will count towards their team score on the scoreboard.
- The scoreboard is the one opposite the team bench. (For Court 1 it is the high board on the south wall, for Court 2 it is the board on the stage end.)
- Games will consist of two 14 minute halves with a 5 minute half time. The clock will run non-stop until the last minute of the half at which time it will stop anytime the whistle blows. The only other time the clock will stop is for time-outs called for by the coaches.
- Each player will wear a rubber colored bracelet and they must guard the player on the other team that is wearing the same color.

PRO LEAGUE:

- Pro League will play with an Intermediate 28.5" size Basketball and the hoops will be at 9'.
- Each Saturday will follow this typical schedule:
 1. 10:30-10:35: Announcements, Prayer and Character focus of the day
 2. 10:35-10:45: Ball Handling Drills
 3. 10:45-11:10: Skill and drill work
 4. 11:10-11:20: Team time with coaches
 5. 11:20-12:15: Game
- Games will consist of two 18 minute halves with a 5 minute half time. The clock will run non-stop until the last minute of the half at which time it will stop anytime the whistle blows. The only other time the clock will stop is for time-outs called for by the coaches.
- The scoreboard is the one opposite the team bench. (For Court 1 it is the high board on the south wall, for Court 2 it is the board on the stage end.)
